

# Senate Journal

## First Extraordinary Session of the Fiftieth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Third Legislative Day, Wednesday, June 1, 2005

The Senate was called to order by Senator Gumm.

Senator Gumm declared a quorum present.

### INTRODUCTION

Senator Kerr introduced his wife, Robbie, their daughter, Robin Wenk, and their grandson, Braxton Wenk, to the Senate. Senator Kerr asked unanimous consent, which was granted, that Braxton be named Honorary Page for this legislative day.

### GENERAL ORDER

**SB 1X** by Morgan of the Senate and Hiatt of the House was called up for consideration.

Senator Laster moved to amend **SB 1X**, Page 151, Line 15½, by inserting a new Section 37 to read as follows:

“SECTION 37. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

The provisions of this act shall be severable. If any portion or application of this act is found to be unconstitutional and void, the remaining portions or application of the act

shall remain valid.”, and by renumbering subsequent section and amending the title to conform, which amendment was declared adopted.

Senator Laster moved to amend **SB 1X**, Page 133, Line 21, by deleting the word and numeral “five (5)” and inserting in lieu thereof the word and numeral “fifteen (15)”, and by amending the title to conform, which amendment was declared adopted.

Senator Laster moved that **SB 1X** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.

### **THIRD READING**

**SB 1X** was read for the third time at length.

On the question of passage of the bill and emergency, the vote resulted as follows:
