# Student Preparation

## Educational Planning and Assessment System (EPAS)

  - Plan – 10<sup>th</sup> Grade
  - ACT – 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Grades
  - EPAS will no longer be available after 2015–2016 academic year
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# Admission Requirements

## Oklahoma State University

Option 1: 3.0 GPA AND top 33.3%

or

Option 2: 3.0 GPA in 15-unit core  
AND 21 ACT/980 SAT

or

Option 3: 24 ACT/1090 SAT

OSU also employs a holistic approach that considers test scores, GPA, Class Rank, student activities, etc.





# Admission Requirements

## Regional Universities

Option 1: 20 ACT or 940 SAT

or

Option 2: 2.7 GPA and top 50%

or

Option 3: 2.7 GPA in 15-unit core

## Community Colleges

No minimum required.

# Course Placement

- ▶ At all colleges and universities, the minimum ACT score in English, Mathematics, Reading and Science required for placement in first year courses is 19
  - ▶ Students not scoring a 19 in any of the areas can take a secondary placement exam, such as Accuplacer, or an institutional exam
  - ▶ Colleges and universities can require a higher score
  - ▶ Many institutions use the ACT Math score to place students in higher level math courses
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
