Second Regular Session of the Sixtieth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Twelfth Legislative Day, Thursday, February 19, 2026

An Act relating to soldiers and sailors; allowing Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs to hire seasonal employees; exempting such employees from benefits; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to veterans; imposing requirements on executive governmental entities to provide information related to certain donations; providing for apportionment or deposit of amounts donated; requiring government websites to provide information related to certain donations; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 3257 – By Hall, Fugate, Hefner and Dollens of the House and Woods of the Senate.

An Act relating to veterans; requiring one hundred percent disability benefits to meet qualifications established by federal law; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 3281 – By Hall, CrosswhiteHader and Kendrix of the House and Bergstrom of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Administrative Procedures Act; enacting the Guidance Transparency Act; amending 75 O.S. 2021, Sections 250.3, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 420, O.S.L. 2025, 250.4a, 250.9, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 7, O.S.L. 2024, and 302 (75 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 250.3 and 250.9), which relate to definitions and other provisions; modifying definitions; providing for public inspection of guidance documents; providing for submission of guidance documents; prescribing requirements for publication; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

HB 4117 – By West (Tammy) and Pae of the House and Stanley of the Senate.

An Act relating to definitions; defining family resource center; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 4275 – By Miller and McCane of the House and Reinhardt of the Senate.

An Act relating to mental health; amending 43A O.S. 2021, Section 3-318, which relates to rules and standards for certification of behavioral health case managers, application for certification, fee, titles, and compliance; providing uniformity in rules and standards for certification for behavioral health case managers; amending 43A O.S. 2021, Section 3-326, which relates to certification as peer recovery support specialists, rules, application, fees, titles, and penalties; providing uniformity in rules and standards for certification for peer recovery support specialists; and providing an effective date.

HB 4298 – By Pae and McCane of the House and Reinhardt of the Senate.

An Act relating to children; amending 10 O.S. 2021, Section 404, which relates to the Oklahoma Child Care Facilities Licensing Act; permitting electronic notice; and providing an effective date.
