HB 2937 – By Olsen and Adams of the House and Hamilton of the Senate.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1272, which relates to the unlawful carry of firearms; allowing for the carry of firearms on vessels; defining term; and providing an effective date.

HB 2960 – By Hardin and Olsen of the House and Bullard of the Senate.

An Act relating to torts; amending 76 O.S. 2021, Section 52.1, which relates to liability of firearm manufacturers; expanding scope of liability exemption to include component parts; and providing an effective date.

HB 3148 – By Gise of the House and Rosino of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1105, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 148, O.S.L. 2025 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1105), which relates to definitions; defining term; requiring inspection by certain individuals; removing certain inspection requirement; requiring inspection at certain sales; modifying certain inspection requirement; authorizing certain inspections; requiring certain collected fee be remitted; requiring deposit of fee; authorizing certain punitive actions; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1105.3, which relates to necessity of vehicle identification number; including salvage pools as entities having certain authorization; and providing an effective date.

HB 3152 – By Grego of the House and Murdock of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 172, which relates to powers and duties of enforcement officers of the Corporation Commission; authorizing general criminal law enforcement authority upon receiving certain consent; deleting certain search and seizure prohibition; and providing an effective date.

HB 3262 – By George of the House and Hines of the Senate.

An Act relating to fees; amending 28 O.S. 2021, Section 153, as amended by Section 5, Chapter 305, O.S.L. 2025 (28 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 153), which relates to fees and costs in criminal proceedings; increasing sheriff's service fee; amending 28 O.S. 2021, Section 162, which relates to fees and costs in juvenile proceedings; increasing sheriff's service fee; and providing an effective date.

HB 3269 – By George of the House and Gollihare of the Senate.

An Act relating to criminal procedure; amending 22 O.S. 2021, Section 171, which relates to issuing arrest warrants by verified complaints; authorizing telephonic or electronic communication of proposed arrest warrants to magistrates; establishing criteria for communicating telephonically; equating orally recorded authorizations by magistrates with issuing arrest warrants; requiring the audio recording, transcribing and filing of conversations related to arrest warrants; providing procedures for obtaining proposed affidavits; and providing an effective date.

HB 3378 – By Ranson of the House and Hines of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5060.6, which relates to the Board of Directors; directing for select Board members to serve two-year terms; directing that terms shall return to four-year terms; and declaring an emergency.

HB 3466 – By Boles of the House and Woods of the Senate.

An Act relating to Corporation Commission; amending 62 O.S. 2021, Section 195, which relates to funds created; removing Corporation Commission petty cash fund; and providing an effective date.

HB 4140 – By Manger of the House and Hines of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1705, as last amended by Section 247, Chapter 486, O.S.L. 2025 and 1713, as amended by Section 249, Chapter 486, O.S.L. 2025 (21 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 1705 and 1713), which relate to grand larceny and receiving stolen property; modifying elements of grand larceny and receiving stolen property; and providing an effective date.

HB 4142 – By Manger of the House and Hines of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1767.1, as amended by Section 459, Chapter 486, O.S.L. 2025, and 1767.3 (21 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1767.1), which relate to the unlawful use of bombs or explosive devices and related definitions; modifying elements of certain crimes; providing construing provision; updating certain defined terms; and providing an effective date.
