**Twenty-second Legislative Day, Tuesday, March 10, 2026**

**HB 1818** – By Newton of the House and Jech of the Senate.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1250.1, which relates to definitions; modifying certain terms; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1253, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 65, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1253), which relates to qualifications and membership for the Oklahoma State Board of Licensed Social Workers; updating the State Board of Licensed Social Workers sunset date; requiring certain members to have at least bachelor's degree; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1261.1, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 109, O.S.L. 2024 (59 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1261.1), which relates to issuing various types of social worker licenses; modifying certain terms; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1265, which relates to titles and abbreviations of social workers; modifying terms; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1270, which relates to licensed social worker titles; amending certain terms; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2975** – By Hardin of the House and Woods of the Senate.

An Act relating to agriculture; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Section 10-9.7, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 372, O.S.L. 2024 (2 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 10-9.7), which relates to nutrient management plans; expanding certain statements that must be made in an amendment to a nutrient management plan; modifying required content of certain annual reports; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2978** – By Banning, Olsen, Hall, Hilbert, Norwood, Staires, Gise, Hays, Hill and Adams of the House and Logan and Jett of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 11-201), which relates to the library media program; prohibiting community standards from including sexually explicit conduct; defining term; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2981** – By Banning and Deck of the House and Hamilton of the Senate.

An Act relating to open meetings; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 5-118, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 4, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 5-118), which relates to regular meetings of school district boards of education; requiring all school district boards of education to post meeting minutes on their website; establishing time limit for compliance; determining accessibility requirements; establishing results for noncompliance; clarifying applicability; and providing an effective date.

**HB 3026** – By Lowe and Miller of the House and Hines of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 18-108, which relates to free public kindergarten; requiring school districts to adopt a policy setting different age requirements for certain international military dependents; providing policy parameters; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

**HB 3194** – By CrosswhiteHader, Hildebrant, Adams, Maynard, Norwood, Gise and Hill of the House and McIntosh and Jett of the Senate.

An Act relating to pregnancy centers; defining terms; prohibiting certain agencies from requiring a pregnancy center to offer or perform abortions; prohibiting certain agencies from requiring a pregnancy center to offer, provide, or distribute abortion-inducing drugs or contraception; prohibiting certain agencies from requiring a pregnancy center to refer for abortion, abortion-inducing drugs, or contraception; prohibiting certain agencies from requiring a pregnancy center to counsel in favor of abortion, abortion-inducing drugs, or contraception; prohibiting certain agencies from requiring a pregnancy center to post any advertisement or similar material that promotes abortion, abortion-inducing drugs, or contraception, or that provides any information about obtaining an abortion, abortion-inducing drugs, or contraception; prohibiting certain agencies from prohibiting a pregnancy center from providing information, care, counseling, classes, or other services related to pregnancy, childbirth, adoption, or parenting; prohibiting certain agencies from prohibiting a pregnancy center from providing pre- and post-natal resources; prohibiting certain agencies from prohibiting a medical pregnancy center from providing medical testing, counseling, and care related to pregnancy or childbirth; prohibiting certain agencies from prohibiting a medical pregnancy center from counseling a woman on any pregnancy-related care or treatment; prohibiting certain agencies from interfering with the pregnancy center's staffing or hiring decisions; providing remedies; providing for severability; and providing an effective date.

**HB 3264** – By George and McCane of the House and Thompson of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 13.1, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 352, O.S.L. 2025 (21 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 13.1), which relates to minimum prison sentences; adding criminal offense to list of crimes; and providing an effective date.

**HB 3266** – By George of the House and Hines of the Senate.

An Act relating to reckless driving; amending Section 15, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 200), which relates to Class D2 felony offenses; adding certain crime to list of D2 felony offenses; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-901, which relates to reckless driving; making certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; and providing an effective date.

**HB 3268** – By George of the House and Hamilton of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending Section 16, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 20P), which relates to Class D3 offenses; modifying list of Class D3 offenses; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1151, as last amended by Section 109, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1151), which relates to offenses and penalties enumerated; classifying the knowing display or manufacture of a fictitious license plate as a Class D3 offense; and providing an effective date.

**HB 3287** – By Roe and Hefner of the House and Stanley of the Senate.

An Act relating to public health and safety; directing hospitals and health care facilities to post certain signage; stating signage requirements; directing hospitals and health care facilities to develop certain protocols and procedures; directing the State Department of Health to promulgate rules; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 3288** – By Roe of the House and Logan of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-103.9, which relates to physical education programs; adding full-day prekindergarten to elementary physical education instruction requirements; increasing amount of weekly physical education instruction for elementary school students; prohibiting the withholding of physical education as a form of punishment; increasing amount of weekly physical activity required for physical education classes; directing schools to provide recess or physical activity before tests or assessments; requiring local school boards to adopt a policy regarding weekly physical education instruction for students in grades six through twelve; increasing amount of recommended daily recess for prekindergarten through fifth grade; and providing an effective date.

Supp. 2025, Section 6-104.8), which relates to maternity leave; entitling certain full-time employees to paid maternity leave following the adoption of a child; specifying when leave must be used; clarifying purpose for which sick leave may be used; and providing an effective date.

**HB 3469** – By Boles and Archer of the House and Green of the Senate.

An Act relating to oil and gas; amending 52 O.S. 2021, Section 318.1, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 24, O.S.L. 2025 (52 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 318.1), which relates to agreement as to compliance with drilling and plugging regulations; authorizing certain operators to make voluntary election; requiring certain notice; authorizing retention of certain right; requiring certain permanence beyond expiration; requiring operators to post surety by certain date; and declaring an emergency.
