## Second Regular Session of the Sixtieth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

**Eighteenth Legislative Day, Tuesday, March 3, 2026**

The Senate was called to order by Senator Jech.

An Act relating to alcoholic beverages; amending 37A O.S. 2021, Section 1-107, which relates to the powers and duties of the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission; requiring an annual report that contains certain information to be made available to certain individuals; requiring report to be made available online; and providing an effective date.

**HB 4300** – By Pae of the House and Reinhardt of the Senate.

An Act relating to children; amending 10 O.S. 2021, Section 404.1, as amended by Section 343, Chapter 486, O.S.L. 2025 (10 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 404.1), which relates to the Oklahoma Child Care Facilities Licensing Act; modifying provision related to criminal history record searches; and providing an effective date.

**SJR 47** – By Paxton of the Senate and Hilbert of the House.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by adding a new Section 6 to Article III; requiring proof of identity to vote in certain elections; requiring proof of identity for all authorized methods of voting; requiring Legislature to enact specific requirements for proof of identity; providing ballot title; ordering special election on certain date; and directing filing.

**SJR 48** – By Paxton of the Senate and Hilbert of the House.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 6B of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution; limiting the reimbursement to counties and other taxing jurisdictions for lost revenue; requiring the Legislature to enact certain laws; updating references; providing ballot title; ordering special election on certain date; and directing filing.
