MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR

Advising his veto of Enrolled **SB 1589**.

Veto message reads as follows:

May 7, 2026

TO THE HONORABLE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE
AND MEMBERS OF THE OKLAHOMA SENATE
SECOND REGULAR SESSION OF THE
SIXTIETH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE
ENROLLED SENATE BILL NO. 1589:

Pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 11 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution, I have vetoed Enrolled Senate Bill 1589.

Oklahoma's gaming laws must be clear, targeted, and fair. Senate Bill 1589 does not accomplish that end. This bill is so broad that it criminalizes everyday apps people use for fun. It also unnecessarily creates a new felony and extends criminal liability to businesses and service providers.

This kind of vague and overbroad approach creates uncertainty for businesses operating in good faith and discourages innovation and investment in our state. Oklahoma can protect consumers without adopting criminal penalties that reach beyond the problem they are intended to solve.

For these reasons, I have vetoed Enrolled Senate Bill 1589.
