

In the last decade, 32 states have reduced both crime and imprisonment rates; Oklahoma has not.

States That Reduced Both Crime and Imprisonment Rates Between 2006 and 2016

- ❑ The 10 Oklahoma Counties with the most fatal drug-overdose rates are all rural.**
- ❑ The ten counties with the highest rate of people reporting frequent mental distress are all rural**
- ❑ Only 1 in ten people in rural communities are receiving treatment**
- ❑ Rural disparities are often missed in legislation.
(Pittsburg County)**
- ❑ Even larger counties like Rogers County are often missed
(SB 252- Median jail stay nonviolent felons- 183 days)**

AND FOUNDING NATO COUNTRIES






